Promoting children's development: Evidence based interventions in family and school contexts

MARCH 6-9, PALERMO-ITALY

The Developmental and Educational Psychology Section of the Italian Association of Psychology (AIP) is pleased to announce the opening of an International Winter Training School for Ph.D. students and early career researchers, to be held next year in Palermo, March 6-9.

Child development scholars are increasingly interested in applied aspects of their research such as children's health and well-being enhancement and possible risks or maladaptive outcomes prevention - particularly advocating families, schools and communities. Understanding developmental processes provides several indications on the way to optimize positive development as well as on how to prevent or minimize problematic outcomes. Evidence based interventions-EBI has therefore become an area of increasing interest for both research and policy, with a special attention in implementing cooperation among researchers, policy makers and practitioners.

This area of investigation and applied studies will then represent a cutting edge theme of developmental disciplines in the next future.

Moving from these considerations, the aims of the International Winter Training School are:

- 1) To present cutting-edge conceptual and methodological issues related to evidence based interventions in developmental psychology, with particular attention to family and school contexts.
- 2) To promote constructive interactions, discussions and cooperation among participants.
- 3) To enhance commitment and future efforts in this important area of developmental applied psychology
- 4) To foster collaboration between Italian and European senior and early career researchers in this area.

Benefits and outcomes of the Training School

The Training School will benefit students and early career researchers by:

- Bringing together Italian and European expertise on evidence based interventions
- Enhancing capacities for designing and implementing EBI research studies
- Fostering analytical and critical skills in designing and promoting research in this area
- Promoting the diffusion of information and publications in international journals and in national and local media.

All candidates have to submit a completed application form in English by January the 12th, 2013. Applicants will be notified by email of acceptance decision by January the 30th, 2013.

Application will include a CV and an abstract of about 500 words describing an on going or a future project on evidence based interventions in the developmental field and have to be sent to the following e-mail address: ebp@unipa.it

Acceptance criteria required:

- Ph. D. Student
- Early career researcher (i.e. maximum 6 years from Ph.D. completion)
- Practitioner in the area of developmental psychology
- Previous experience or research projects in the field of EBI.
